The department is in receipt of correspondence requesting registration of Sunbulb Company Inc., as a Medical Marijuana Treatment Center pursuant to section 381.986 8(a) 2, F. S. Because the department finds that Sunbulb Company Inc. is a qualified entity for registration and has demonstrated its ability to begin cultivation within thirty (30) days of licensure, Sunbulb Company, Inc. is hereby registered as a Medical Marijuana Treatment Center. Sunbulb Company, Inc. is authorized to dispense low-THC cannabis, medical cannabis, and cannabis delivery devices ordered and entered into the Compassionate Use Registry in accordance with Regulation 1-1.01.

Sunbulb has 10 business days to post a performance bond, irrevocable letter of credit payable to the Florida Department of Health or cash in the amount of \$5 million in accordance with sections 381.986(8)(b)7.a. and b., Florida Statutes, and Rule 64-4.002(5)(e), of the Florida Administrative Code

Sunbulb has 30 days from this approval to request Cultivation Authorization. Failure to meet the deadline to seek Cultivation Authority may result in the revocation of the Department's approval. Please note, no cannabis plant source material may be present in any Dispensing Organization facility prior to Cultivation Authorization.

No less than 10 calendar days prior to the initial processing of cannabis, Sunbulb must notify the Department that it is ready to begin processing, is in compliance with section 381.986, F.S., and Chapter 64-4 of the Florida Administrative Code, and is seeking Processing Authorization.

Sunbulb must begin dispensing derivative product within 210 calendar days of being granted cultivation authorization. No less than 10 calendar days prior to the initial dispensing of derivative product, Sunbulb must notify the Department that it is ready to begin dispensing, is in compliance with section 381.986, F.S., and Chapter 64-4, of the Florida Administrative

Code, and is seeking Dispensing Authorization. Failure to meet the deadline to begin dispensing may result in the revocation of the Department's approval.
